

Hogwarts Class Lessons

Welcome to *Defense Against the Dark Arts*!

Today's lesson: dueling.

Your task: invite a friend to learn the proper way to duel by following the below instructions. Then practice!

- 1. To start, each wizard stands back to back with their wand in front of their face
- 2. Next, each wizard takes 5 steps forward, and turns to face their opponent.
- 3. Then, each wizard draws the first letter of their house name in the air with their wand before pointing it at their opponent:
 - Draw "H" if you're in Hufflepuff
 - Draw "R" if you're in Ravenclaw
 - Draw "G" if you're in Gryffindor
 - Draw "S" if you're in Slytherin
- 4. Each wizard places their wand over their heart and bows to their opponent.
- 5. Together, to the count of 1-2-3, each wizard crosses their wand in front of them to the right (1); then to the left (2); and then straight at their opponent (3). On the third count, each wizard will shout one of the following three spells:
 - Expelliarmus: expelliarmus beats stupefy
 - Stupefy: stupefy beats diffindo
 - Diffindo: diffindo beats expelliarmus







- 6. The wizard whose spell loses must take one step backwards:
 - Expelliarmus beats Stupefy
 - Stupefy beats Diffindo
 - Diffindo beats Expelliarmus
- 7. In the case of a tie, the duel ends in a draw and the wizards must cast again.
- 8. Repeat steps 5 to 7, waiving your wands to the count of 1-2-3 and casting additional spells on the third count.

The first wizard to take 3 steps backwards disappears, and the remaining wizard reigns!

Want to duel with other spells? Try these:

Confundo

- Confundo beats Expecto Patronum, because it prevents the opponent from focusing their thoughts on a happy memory!

Petrificus Totalus

 Petrificus Totalus beats Confundo because it stops the opponent from moving their arms, and thus prevents them from casting a curse!

Expecto Patronum

 Expecto Patronum beats Petrificus Totalus because a Patronus can tackle an opponent before they have enough time to cast a Petrificus Totalus spell!
