Inspired by Nature

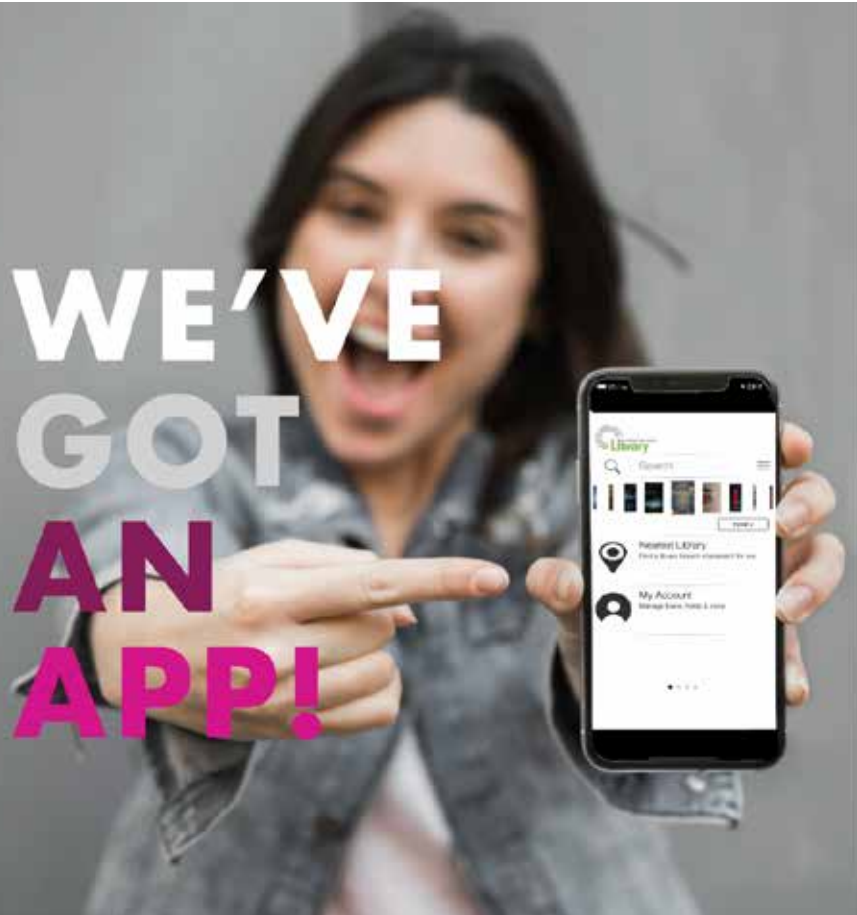
Ages: Family (ages 4-10)
