
During this transiton period, customers can visit the Library's other three locations (Central, Richmond Green and Richvale).

This program is co-created and delivered by more than 2,000 public libraries across Canada. The club celebrates Canadian authors, illustrators and stories, and is designed to inspire kids to explore the fun of reading their way.











2019 Richmond Hill Community Survey Results Are In!

The survey, conducted by Ipsos for the City of Richmond Hill between March 25 and April 9, 2019, asked 800 randomly selected residents (aged 18+) a series of questions to measure satisfaction with municipal services provided in Richmond Hill.

The results are in, and the responses indicate that RHPL has earned your approval. The Library achieved **92% overall resident satisfaction**, with 64% reporting that they're "very satisfied" with library service in Richmond Hill.

RHPL is proud to serve our community as we continue to meet its changing needs. As a vital community hub, we strive to inspire our customers to come together in spaces that are repositories of lifelong learning.
