Magically Invisible Messages

Lemon juice is an organic substance that oxidizes and turns brown when heated. Diluting the lemon juice in water makes it very hard to notice when you apply it to the paper, no one will be aware of its presence until it is heated and the secret message is revealed. Other substances which work in the same way include orange juice, honey, milk, onion juice, and vinegar. Also, since lemon juice ink is a weak acid, it softens the fibers in the paper. The added heat causes some of the chemical bonds to break down in the dried juice and some carbon was cut loose. When the acidic parts of the paper are gently heated, they turn brown before the untreated paper does.

Materials

- Plain white paper
- Lemon juice in a cup or bowl
- Cotton swabs
- Hair dryer

Instructions

- 1. Dip the cotton swab in the lemon juice and write something on the paper.
- 2. Let the paper dry completely.
- 3. Gently heat the paper with the hair dryer to reveal the hidden message.
